- EU-funded contract with CHAFEA
- December 2016 December 2018
- Consortium led by Milieu Ltd, 3 thematic partners and a communications team
- Combines elements of data gathering + analysis with dissemination,
 experience exchange and learning

Project Objectives

- To complement the existing knowledge on the ESIF 2014-2020 investments in the health sector
- To assess how these can contribute to implementing EU health policy goals, particularly reducing health inequalities and supporting structural reforms
- To **further develop capacities** of the relevant actors in EU Member States and regions to support the effective and consistent implementation of ESIF for health.

Challenges for health systems

- Ensuring the financial sustainability of healthcare services
- Threats to public funding for health care
- Needs to shift away from long-term institutional care towards community-based service
- Over-reliance on institution- or hospital-based service delivery
- Needs to strengthen primary care and integration of services

Relevant ESI Fund spending priorities: Health systems

- Thematic Objective 9: Promoting social inclusion and combating poverty
- Thematic Objective 11: Enhancing institutional capacity and ensuring an efficient public administration

Programming of health-related projects

- 11 broad Thematic Objectives (TOs)
- More detailed Investment Priorities given for TO in fund-specific regulations
- Specific Objectives adjusted to the needs of the MS and regions

Programme indicators

- MS use indicators tracking progress of implementation of the SOs and the projects
- Only one common indicator relating to health: *Population covered by improved health services*

Thematic Objective

9. Promoting social inclusion, combating poverty and any discrimination

Investment Priority

9a. Investing in health and social infrastructure which ... reduces inequalities in terms of health status

Specific Objective (Latvia)

To increase the availability of social services at home equivalent to the high quality services of institutional care...

Indicator (Latvia)

Increase the share of people with mental disorders who live outside institutions and for whom community based services are available


Projects supporting health system reform 2014-2020

Methodology for data collection and synthesis Key steps:

- 1. Data sources programming documents (OPs) and 'lists of operations'
- 2. Consistent method to identify, classify and track data
- 3. Identifying the planned health investments review of 197 national/regional OPs and 76 INTERREG CPs
- **4. Identifying the actual health investments** review of the lists of operations for all reviewed OPs/CPs
- **5. Developing outputs:** country factsheets, INTERREG and thematic mapping documents based on Excel database of over 6,000 projects


ESIF health-relevant projects, 2014-2017

- **6,414** health projects, including 221 INTERREG projects
- Total spending of approx. € 6 billion (including € 0.5 billion for INTERREG projects)




Health system reform projects

- 1399 projects in 14 Member States
- Total investment: € 1.4 billion
- Average investment per project: € 1 million



Health system reform projects by Member State


- 1399 projects in 14 Member States and INTERREG
- Most projects: Poland, Bulgaria, Lithuania, Greece

- Total investment: € 1.4 billion
- Average investment per project: € 1 million

ESIF spending should be policy relevant...
